The 'Next Generation' of polio survivors have largely arrived from countries where polio is still active, or only more recently declared polio-free.

There is no information on how many polio survivors have migrated from overseas. However, nearly half of the post-polio patients that Polio Services Victoria saw in 2016 were born overseas.
